Leonid Olijnyk was born in the Ukraine and came to Australia in 1949 at the age of fourteen. He studied Photography at the South Australian Institute of Technology and consequently lectured for several years in Photographic Techniques.

Leonid has a unique style of photography and presentation that is completely original. Using precision high definition cameras, and printing on archival fine art papers, Leonid creates works of art that capture a moment in time never to be forgotten. He strives for simplicity and visual impact - the camera in his hands is an extension of himself. "Come share the vision that I have seen" is his maxim!

Photographs of the Australian Landscape have won Leonid several awards from the Australian Institute of Professional Photography and in 1988 he received the SA Bicentennial Photographic Award for a magnificent seascape.



With his wife Elynor he established the Photographic Art Gallery and Studio at Marino, where he specializes in portraiture, photographing and printing limited edition pictures, digitally enhancing images, restoring family photographs, and continuing to create his distinctive productions of fine art photography.

These four artists have been planning this exhibition for several years. Each were asked to consider ideas within the theme: that of narrative, poetry, social commentary and direct communication and how they are conveyed by words, symbols and/or images. They were also asked to consider the process – the physical act of writing, mark making and creating symbols in order to convey a message.

Working both literally and abstractly, the artists have used a range of disciplines and a variety of materials and techniques when exploring their individual interpretation of the theme.

The exhibition includes some large densely stitched textile hangings, smaller textile artworks as well as works on paper and canvas, and 3D works in the form of artist's books and containers.

Andie Marten creates using drawing, print, stitch, found objects – whatever suits the purpose. As life's experiences accumulate, she finds the connection to her past becomes stronger and much of her work draws on remembered places, stories, childhood adventures and family anecdotes.

Mem Graham works with mixed media and textiles. She is drawn to the abstract, starting with an idea rather than anything visual. Mem is inspired by the elements of line and texture, and enjoys the unpredictability of working intuitively.

Isobel McGarry has always seen cloth as a narrative, a way of telling a story or recording an experience or event. Most particularly, she loves the meditative state of hand stitching and the dreaming through long hours of work with needle and thread.

Wendy Wright's art practice is often informed by the natural world. She works in printmaking and water colour, drawing inspiration for most of her work from nature and concerns for ecological issues.
